

Parents' Guide to Standards Based Grading

What is Standards Based Grading?

- A system where grades are determined by how well a student has shown his/her understanding of individual standards that are taught.
 - Standards are based on grade-level expectations (GLEs) set by the
 Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
- Individual assignments and tests may not be shown in SIS, however, the student's knowledge of each standard being taught is present.

Who is using Standards Based Grading?

ullet All 8th grade teachers are using some form of SBG in their classrooms this school year.

Why are we using Standards Based Grading?

- Grades should show how much students know and understand, NOT how much effort they are willing to put forth.
 - o Things like participation or bonus points are not included in a student's grade.
- SBG helps teachers, students, and parents understand what learning goals students need by showing specific areas of content where students have strengths and weaknesses.


How can I help my child use Standards Based Grading?

- Encourage your child to put forth his/her best effort on all assignments.
- · Celebrate with your child when he/she has shown mastery of standard(s).
- Discuss areas where your child is not performing well and provide assistance and/or additional practice if possible.
 - o Speak to the teacher about how to do this.
- Help your child set learning goals based on his/her areas of need.


